## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Hackathons are multi-day events designed for the ideation and presentation of innovative ideas related to a theme. Hackathon themes are generally broad with well-defined and narrower subthemes (tracks) that students join to collaboratively develop specific solutions. Hackathon solutions can be new or enhanced inventions, technologies, forms of communication, or entrepreneurial ventures.

By exploring HackBAC 2024's theme, Rooted Renaissance: Revolutionizing BIPOC Communities through Environmental Equity & Justice participants will explore their identity in relation to the environment and learn about climate change and activists of color leading the charge.

During the three-and-a-half-day intensive in-person program, students will use their genius and work collaboratively with cross-school teams to create innovative ideas and solutions to build more equitable policies, practices, and programs for environmental sustainability.
